



# Olive-capped Warbler

Scientific Name: Dendroica pityophila

Olive-capped warblers are only found in The Bahamas and Cuba. These birds grow to about 12.5 cm (5 in) in length and have a greenish-yellow crown and yellow throat and chest bordered by black spots. In The Bahamas, this warbler can only be found on Grand Bahama and Abaco Island in pine forests.

Olive-capped warblers are usually found in treetops, though they may forage on the forest floor during breeding season. They feed primarily on insects and spiders. These warblers form cup-shaped nests lined with feathers, usually built 2-14 m (7-45 ft) above the ground. The nests are high up in pine trees and close to the trunk, making them very difficult to locate.
